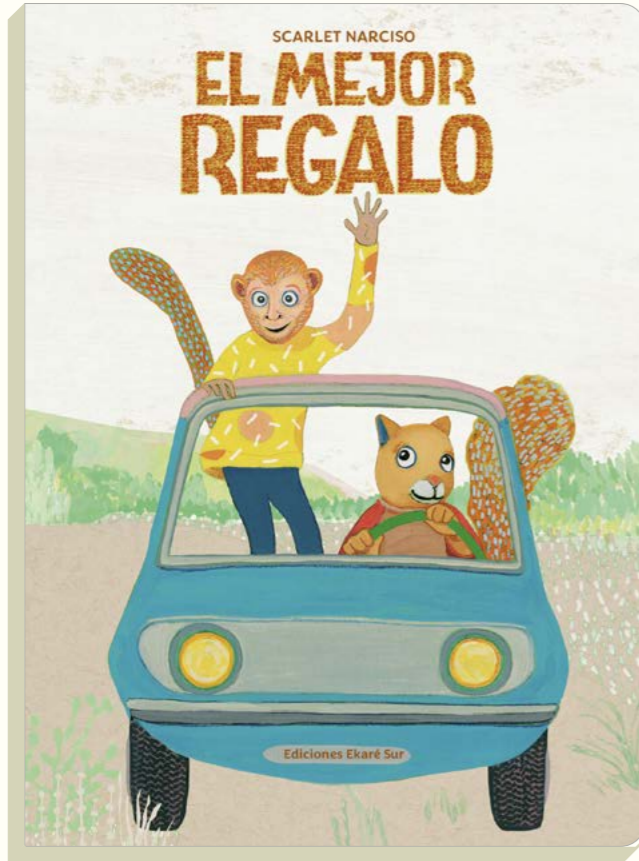
Come and See Mexican Art

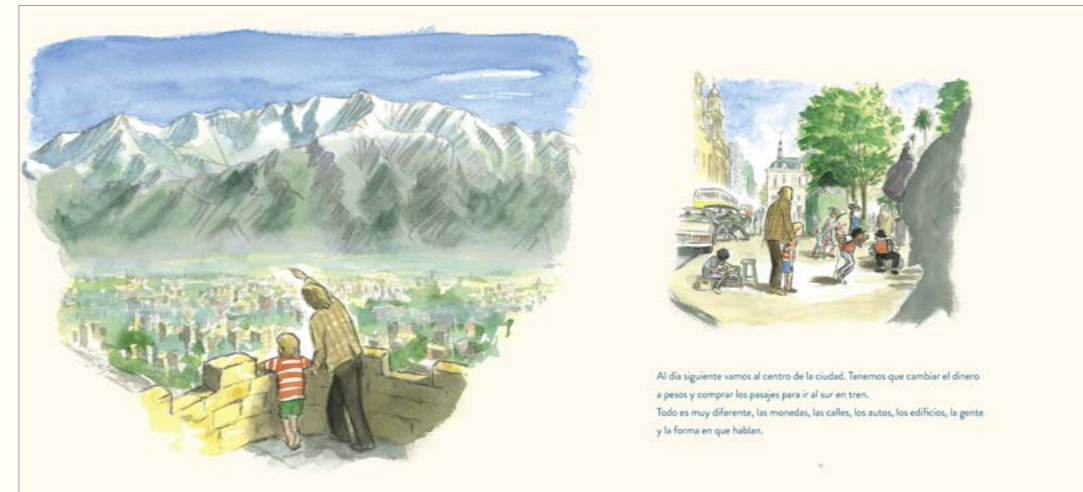
Lost

In commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the coup d'état in Chile, this book takes readers back to the dark times of the dictatorship through the eyes of a young boy.



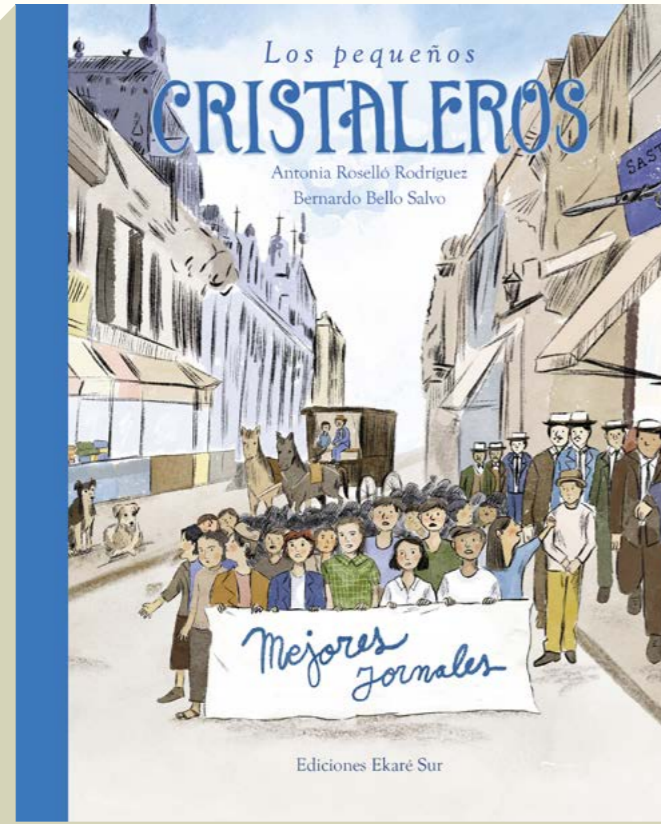

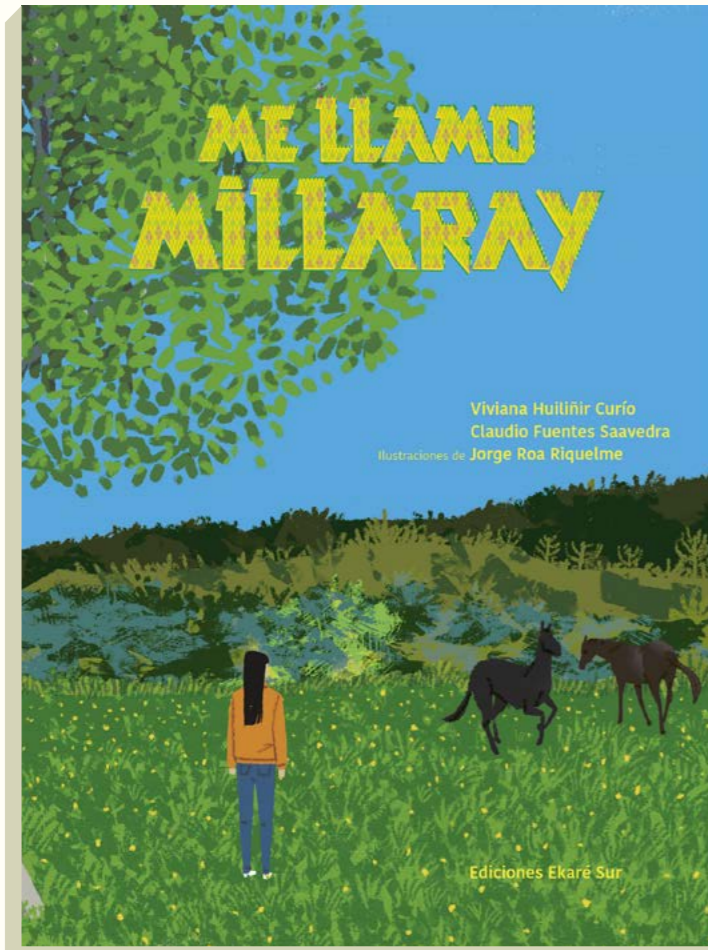
The little crystal makers

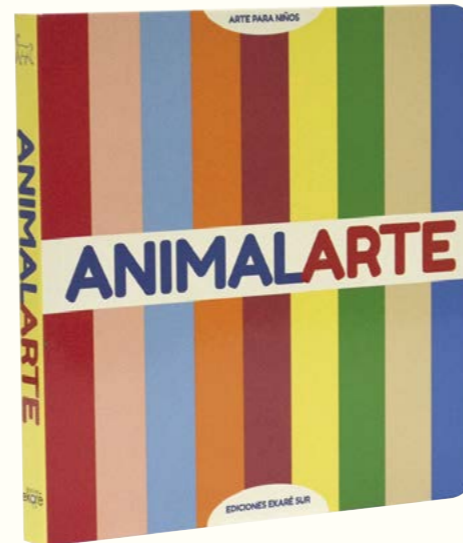
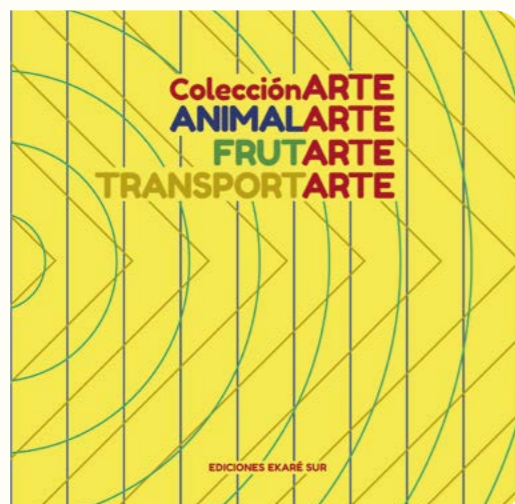


Blue Mountain

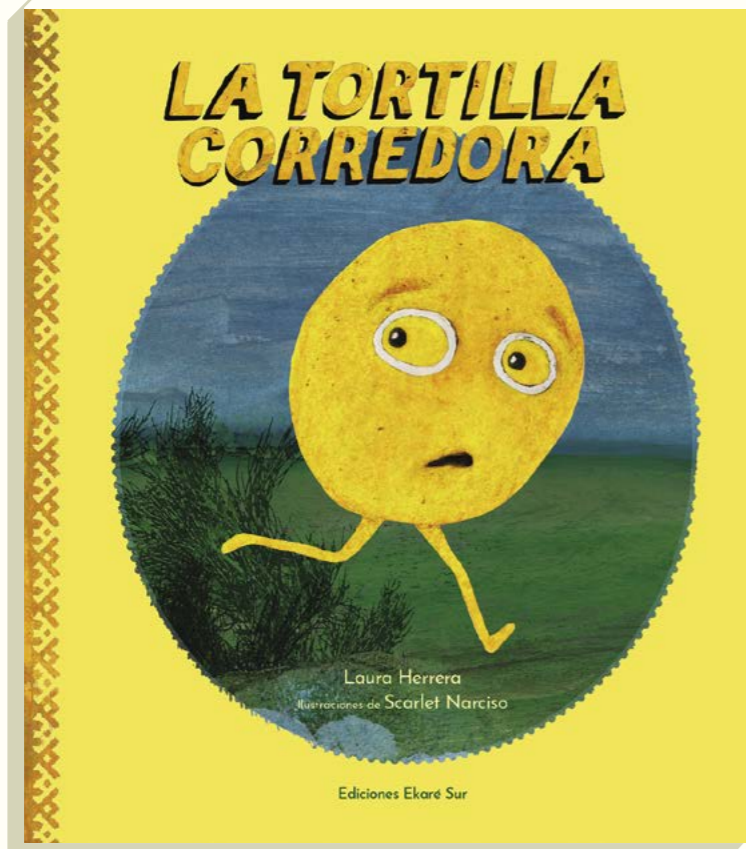
Blue Cat

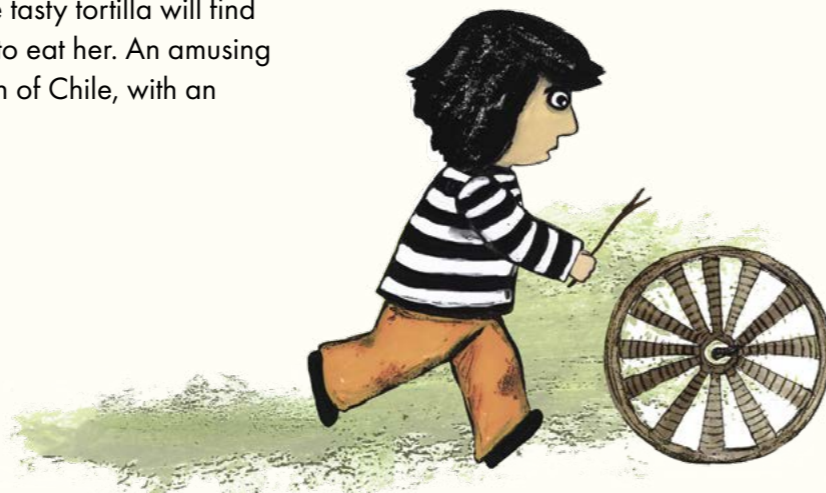

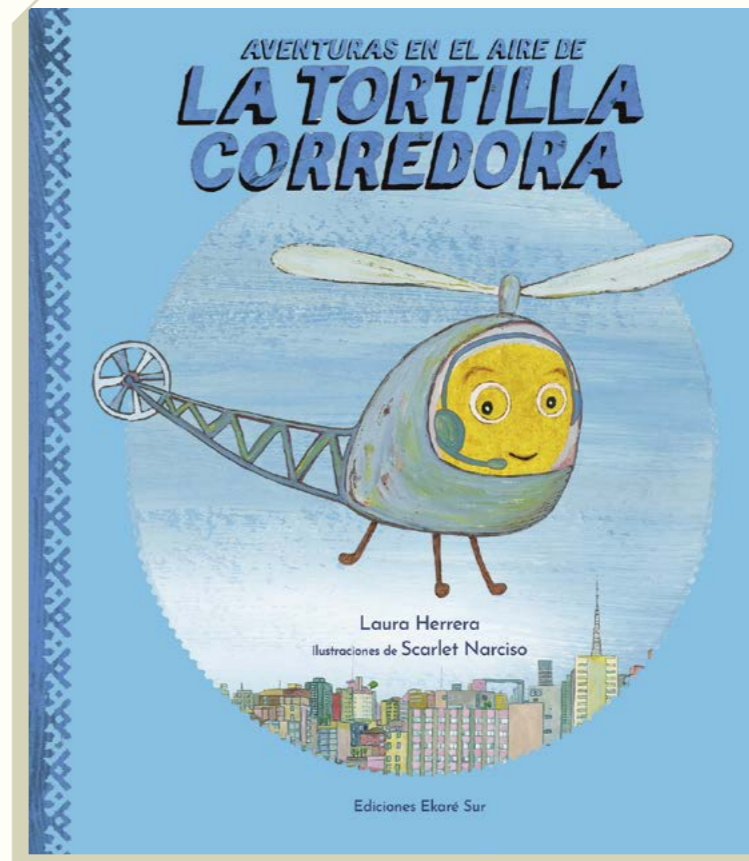


The Running Tortilla

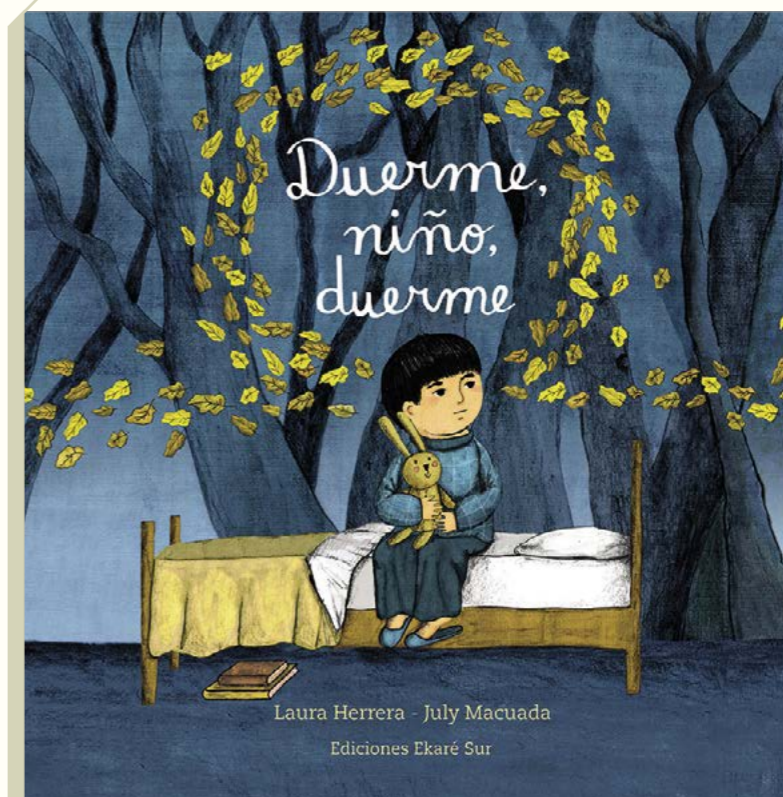


Little Red Riding Hood and the Big Bad Wolf

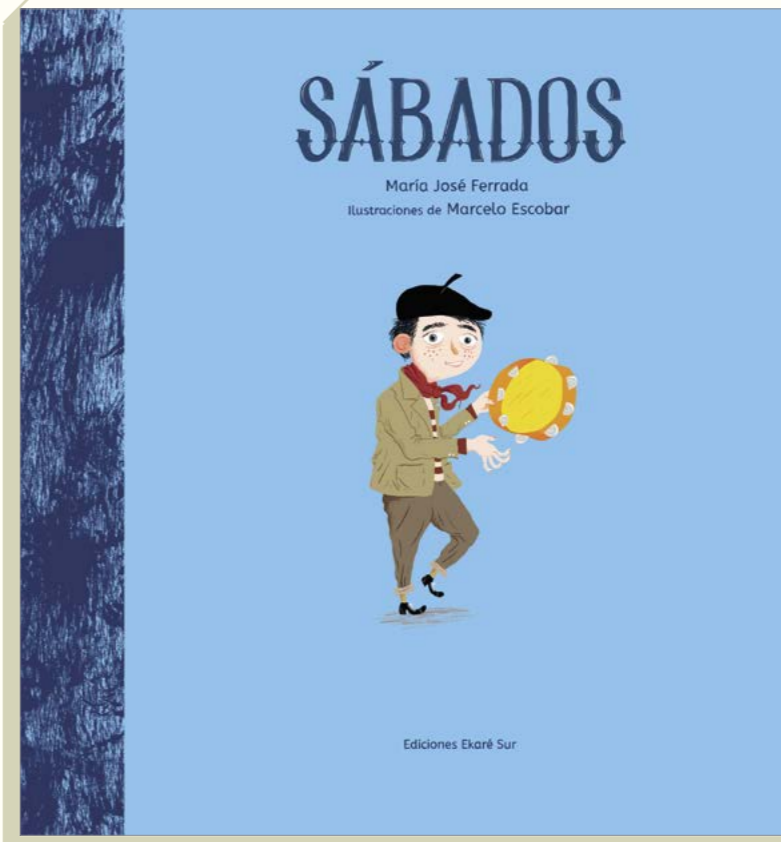
A Sunny Day

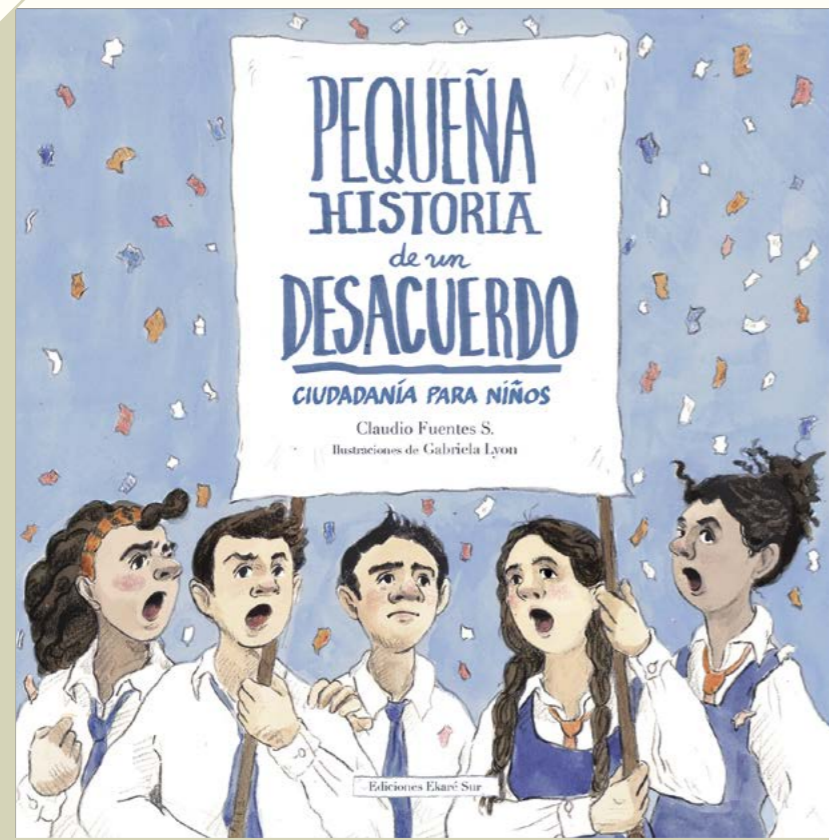
The Adventures of Birdman. Five Operas Told to Children.

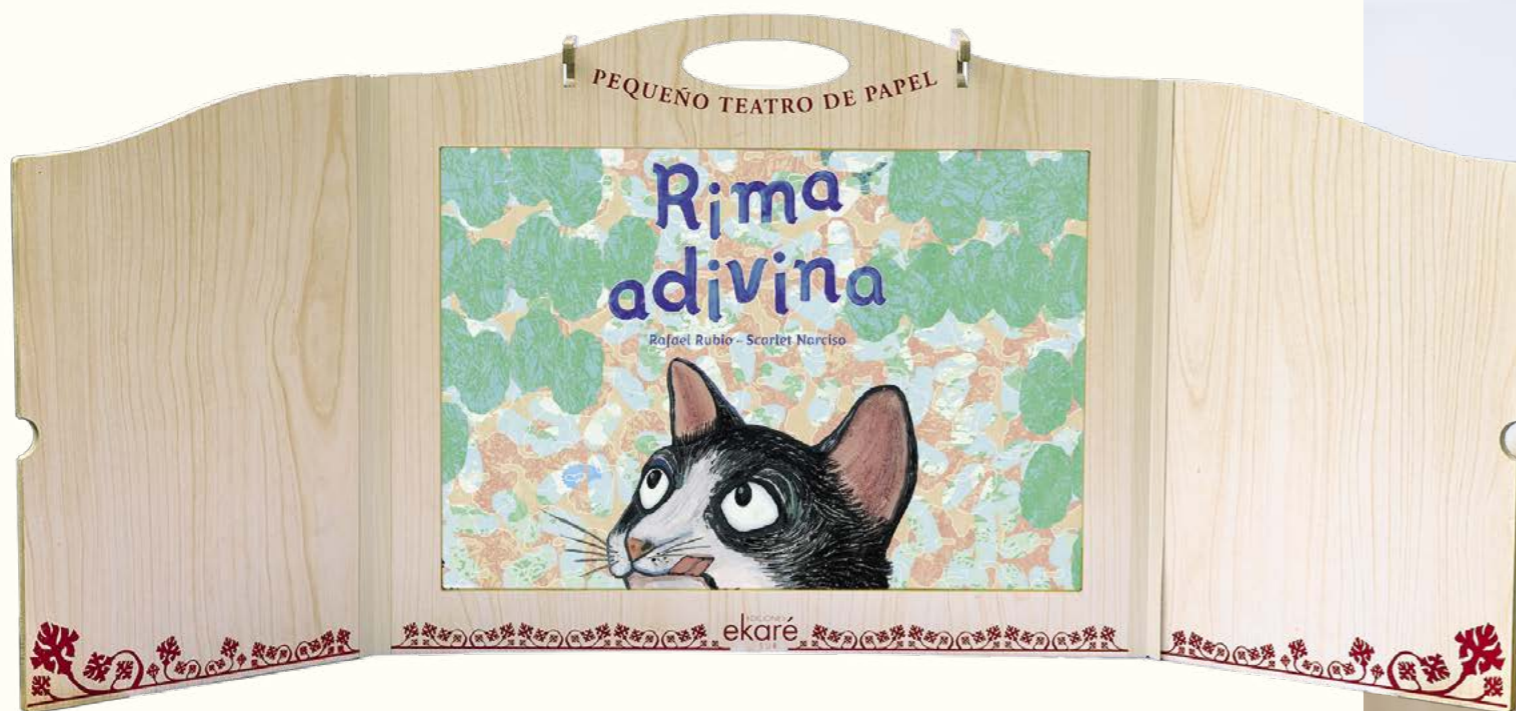
South of Alameda. *Diary of an Occupation*
